The U boat moored on the quay with several Naval craft including a submarine and the submarine tender USS Bushnell






These 1955 photos from Bob Shouse show our LCU from stern and bow with actual buoyant ascent training.

The two bells, deployed from the bow of the "U boat", are being used for open sea training of buoyant ascent, a procedure that, if followed correctly, will enable a scuba diver to safely ascend from depth to the surface despite a loss of his air supply.

In the underwater photos you can see the safety men holding down the trainee until he follows the correct procedure. "Look to your right, look to your left, put your head back and blow out all of the air in your lungs." "Keep your head back and keep blowing through your lips like you were whistling until you reach the surface."

Those instructions will stir memories for both instructors and students
